ROAD SAFETY

As the school holidays approach, it is important to remember when walking near roads, footpaths, or near driveways and in carparks, always:

- talk to your child about road safety. Talk about how to be safe when near roads. Be a good role model.
- point out road safety dangers and differences in new environments. This is especially important when on holidays in different surroundings. Roads, footpaths and pedestrian facilities may look different in holiday areas.

The best way to keep your child safe on or near the road is to hold their hand.

Talk to your child daily about road safety.

OPPORTUNITY CLASS OR SELECTIVE HIGH SCHOOL 2026

Parents and carers who are interested in having their child attend an opportunity class or a selective high school in 2026 can apply now.

From this year on, the application period for Year 5 entry to opportunity classes and Year 7 entry to selective high schools, will open at the same time and remain open over a longer period.

For 2026 entry, the combined opportunity classes and selective high schools' application period is from 7 November 2024 to 21 February 2025. Parents and carers must apply during the designated application period, as late applications will not be accepted.

As the application period for opportunity class placement is now open much earlier, students seeking placement in an opportunity class will still be in Year 3 when applications open and in Year 4 when applications close.

Students seeking selective high school placement are in Year 5 when applications open and in Year 6 when applications close.

Applicants can submit their application through a link that will be available on the Selective high schools and opportunity classes <u>webpage</u>. The application link is only available during the application period: 7 November 2024 to 21 February 2025.

The opportunity class and selective high school placement tests will be computer-based from 2025 and will be held at dedicated test centres from 2 to 4 May 2025. Applicants will be allocated a test date and time on one of those days. Laptops will be provided.

WHOOPING COUGH

NSW Health has asked schools to share this advice with families and remind you to be aware of the symptoms of whooping cough (pertussis), as the number of cases in NSW continues to rise.

The highest rates are seen in school-aged children aged 5 to 16 years.

Whooping cough starts like a cold with a blocked or runny nose, sneezing, a mild fever and an occasional cough. Coughing bouts can worsen and be followed by vomiting, choking or taking a big gasping breath which causes a "whooping" sound. The cough can last for many weeks and can be worse at night.

Children and adults may just have a mild cough that doesn't go away. In adults the cough commonly lasts 5–7 weeks, sometimes longer.

Adolescents are offered a free pertussis vaccine through the Year 7 school vaccination program, as immunity decreases following their early childhood vaccines. GPs can administer free catch-up vaccination to children and adolescents for those who have missed doses. Pharmacists can also administer these free for children aged 5-19 years. The best protection against pertussis infection is vaccination.

Large outbreaks of whooping cough usually occur every 3 to 4 years as population immunity decreases. Lower exposure to whooping cough during the COVID-19 pandemic is a likely reason for this current increase.

If you think you or a family member might have whooping cough

If you or your child's situation is life-threatening, please call Triple Zero (000) or present to your nearest emergency department immediately.

If it's not an emergency, call healthdirect on 1800 022 222 if you or your child are unwell and you're not sure where to go. healthdirect is free and available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. A nurse will answer your call, ask some questions and connect you with the right care.

If given early, antibiotics can reduce the duration of whooping cough symptoms. After 5 days of treatment with appropriate antibiotics, people with whooping cough are no longer infectious. Without treatment, they will remain infectious for 21 days. Antibiotics are rarely needed if it has been 3 weeks since cough onset.
